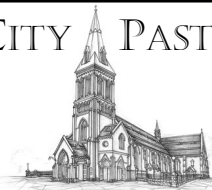

**14TH SUNDAY ORDINARY TIME 8 JULY 2018**

When we read this gospel we can shake our heads in disgust and wonder what sort of a community the people of Nazareth were to have turned their back on Jesus. And yet when we do this, we may miss the whole point of the gospel story. We fail to see that every day we can be guilty of this type of behaviour. We imitate the people who are the presence of God in our midst. Lack of trust limits their ministry also. The problem about God and Nazareth was that God came to Nazareth in the form of a local, one of the villagers, and the community could not come to terms with the situation. They did not recognise the obvious – that God is present among people – the truth was staring them in the face but it was too familiar for them to recognise. Christ's family circumstances were too well known among the villagers and they felt because he was a native that he had nothing to offer. After all, he was only one of themselves. The unkindest cut of all – they knew him too well to be able to recognise the finger of God in their midst.

Life in many ways, is about searching for God but many of us go looking for him in the far off hills and in obscure places. We pleasantly forget the obvious that God moves in mysterious ways, and is most likely to be present in the ordinary bits and pieces of life and shows up more often than we think. He is not apart from the world, nor is he confined or controlled by religious ritual and language. We meet him in every person, place and moment that comes our way. The trouble with us is that because we stand so close to one another, we only see the faults and take for granted the great gifts of goodness which we all possess. We become a community of knockers and begrudgers once we allow ourselves to be blinded by jealousy and family prejudice. If we can put a bad word or interpretation on a

neighbour's act of kindness we won't miss the opportunity to comment.

This gospel is asking us to say thanks and to give honour and recognition to the prophets of God's goodness in our midst. So express some appreciation today for the person you married, a word of praise for the lady who cooks the dinner, for the wage earner, for the neighbour who chats to you over the fence and for the friends who gave you time, support and attention during a recent bereavement. Let us not take for granted the presence of God among us as evidenced in the goodness shown by family and friends.
