Pastor's Note

When Jesus explained to His disciples that He must suffer, die and rise again in three days, they did not understand what He was talking about. All they saw was the glory and honour that came with how popular Jesus was with the people. In a way, the Jesus they saw was one who was influential and by being associated with Him, they too could gain benefits through His popularity. "I am the most important of the twelve", "can I sit at your left or your right when you come into your kingdom?". These were the thoughts of the disciples.

This is not the discipleship Jesus had in mind for them. "Follow me" was the great invitation offered to them by Jesus, but they needed to understand that in order to share in His glory, they must also share in His mission, that is the salvation of all peoples. If I the master is willing to give my life for sake of all, what are you willing to give? The is the question Jesus placed before His disciples and it is the same question Jesus is asking each one of us today. Are we willing to share in the mission of Christ, as challenging as it may be, so as to merit a share in His divine glory? Jesus even used a simple example: welcome this little child as you would welcome me. It isn't something that is impossible to do. In fact if we are willing to open our hearts, it isn't even all that difficult. All that is asked of us is a spirit of charity. Let us answer "yes" to our Lord and love our brothers and sisters the way Jesus loves us.
