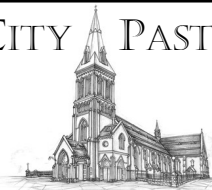
AUCKLAND INNER CITY PASTORAL AREA

FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER ~ 15 MAY 2022

Greetings of peace, joy and LOVE!

Antioch is where the followers of Jesus were called Christians for the first time. This was also the place where the first missionary journey (first reading) of Paul and Barnabas took place. Although they encountered several challenges along the way, their enthusiasm for missionary works led them to the foundation of a faithful and robust community. It only shows that whenever we entrust everything to God, we will never be forsaken. God will always be there to strengthen us amidst the difficulties and challenges we encounter along the way.

Antioch reminds me of the song that goes "...and they'll know we are Christians by our love, by our love yes they'll know we are Christians by our love!" "Look how they love one another!" These were the words of people who saw the first Christians.

These were also the words I repeatedly said to people during this pandemic. How people learned to care for one another! How people show their concern for others! How our frontliners travel from one place to another just to serve those people affected by the virus! How people learned to value the life of others regardless of their religion, culture, language and ethnicity. These gestures are a concrete manifestation of the love and concern which the Gospel today reminds us of. Jesus commanded his disciples to love one another. It is tantamount to saying that we take good care of each other.

For love can be expressed in so many varied ways. Truly amidst the challenges we are

facing now in this pandemic, the concern and encouragement of people around us, and loving service, can help us to realise that God's love is alive.

We can really call ourselves Christians when we learn to love without counting the cost and expect nothing in return. This is how Jesus has loved us!

Covid in the Community & the Cathedral App

With Covid still in the very active in Auckland and indeed affecting many of the priests in the Diocese, there maybe a situation in the future where we may need to cancel Masses at the last minute if we cannot get adequate cover. We strongly advise you to download our Cathedral App from the from Google and Apple stores. From here we are able to send out notifications of events and urgent news such as we have recently with Covid exposures at Masses.

Once you have downloaded the App, login and create a profile and from there you can contact us, update your details with the parish, read the latest newsletter, have ready access to any important notifications links to our Spotify, Facebook pages etc.

*** Please note that the Square is owned by Auckland Council and NOT the Church. ***

It is designated a pedestrian mall and parking is not permitted.

Cars parked illegally may be fined or towed by city parking wardens.

Spaces on either side of the Cathedral doors must be kept clear for the disabled.

\$4 SUNDAY MASS PARKING is available at WILSON CAR PARK HOBSON ST (old Farmers) and **\$2 SUNDAY MASS PARKING is available at WILSON CAR PARK DURHAM LANE.** Your ticket must be validated in the Cathedral before returning to Wilson's. The validator is at the left as you enter the main doors of the Cathedral. As soon as the light turns RED

withdraw your card! When you return to Wilson's go to the payment machine.

It helps to have **TWO DOLLAR COINS** ready for payment to exit.
